CITY COUNCIL PLANS PUBLIC MEETING.

The Mayor has requested that the Town of Medicine Lake hold a public meeting to receive input concerning several matters of the town. The topics to be covered are:

1. Our water system and the lawsuit process.
2. Ordinance #78 (dogs).
3. Purposed sewer and garbage rate increases.
4. The Community Development Block Grant.
5. Police protection in the Town
6. Other concerns of the community.

This meeting will be held on JANUARY 22ND, 2003. We will hold two sessions to accommodate the public. The first session will be at 2:00 p.m. at the LAKETONIAN CAFÉ. UPDATE ON COMMUNITY BLOCK GRANT AND WATER LAWSUIT

Unfortunately we do not have much to report on either of these projects. The Community Development Block Grant has been submitted for \$480,000, and we will not hear about it's approval until January.

The water system Lawsuit has also hit a slow spot as the designers of the plant continue to debate HOW to fix the problem. (You would have thought they would have thought about that in the first place!) We continue to keep in touch with our attorney as to any progress that takes place.
